## **PATIENT DEMOGRAPHICS & ENGAGEMENT**

# We support patients with all types and stages of cancer and through all parts of the journey — from the time of diagnosis, through treatment, and beyond.

The average age of our patients is 59 with the majority (65%) being 55 or older. Our patients' regional distribution closely represents the province's population distribution. We continue to expand our reach to support more patients affected by cancer across the province and beyond. In 2022/2023 we:

- Experienced a 16% overall increase in the number of patients and an unprecedented 29% increase in new patients during the 2022/23 period.
- Witnessed a 70% surge in patient engagement through services on a monthly basis compared to the pre-pandemic period.
- Observed a remarkable 153% rise in total patient visits annually compared to the pre-pandemic timeframe.
- Attracted patients from over 200 diverse communities, including rural and remote areas.

### **EXPANDING OUR REACH:** TRANSFORMING ACCESS TO CANCER CARE

Our commitment to accessible supportive cancer care is propelled by strategic digital transformation. This investment has magnified our virtual delivery capabilities, extending services beyond our centers in Vancouver, Victoria, and Kelowna.

Our patient demographic has shifted, with 50% of patients residing beyond centre cities, and 36% living over 40 km away. Now touching over 200 communities, our reach is far-reaching and impactful.

Our digital evolution allows us to break down geographical and financial barriers, opening doors to care for underserved populations and communities.



### Kamloops: A Testament to Impact

This year, our journey took us to Kamloops and its surrounding areas, where we witnessed a remarkable surge in demand. Patient numbers rose by an astounding 219% over the previous year. This trend exemplifies the tangible and immediate impact we can achieve in even the most remote regions.

## InspireHealth is supporting patients in over **200** BC communities.

50% of InspireHealth patients currently reside outside our city centres in Vancouver, Victoria and Kelowna.



36% of InspireHealth patients currently live more than 40km outside of our city centre in Vancouver, Victoria and Kelowna.



### How we removed barriers for patients across the province:

### 🔍 Rural & Remote Reach

InspireHealth's virtual platform breaks down geographical and financial barriers, allowing more rural and remote patients to access services. Notable growth in regions like Kamloops showcases the success of these efforts, with partnerships and in-person programs enhancing support.

### Elderly Population Support

As the elderly population grows, InspireHealth addresses the pressing need for essential support services, with 65% of patients being 55 years or older. Special focus is directed towards catering to this vulnerable elderly cancer population.

#### Culturally Safe Indigenous Care

Building relationships with Indigenous communities and the First Nations Health Authority highlights InspireHealth's commitment to making cancer care culturally safe. Initiatives include cultural safety training, education on Indigenous history, and respectful land acknowledgements.

### Adolescent and Young Adults Support

Collaborations with organizations like the Canadian Cancer Society and Young Adult Cancer Canada aim to provide targeted support for the adolescent and young adult population, with ongoing research and initiatives to reach and educate this group.

## **COMPREHENSIVE PATIENT PROGRAMS** PERSONALIZED EMPOWERMENT & SUPPORT

### **Clinical Support:**

This year, our clinical team of physicians, counsellors, dietitians and exercise therapists also continued to provide individualized, one-on-one patient support through our virtual platform, and in-person through our Vancouver, Victoria, and Kelowna centres.

## Areas of support include:

- Managing the side effects of cancer treatments
- Stress reduction and mental health support
- Reducing loneliness and isolation during cancer
- Nutrition support
- Exercise therapy for better recovery
- Improving sleep and reducing fatigue
- Supporting challenges related to sexual health & well-being

This year, InspireHealth proudly unveiled three new programs, offering valuable resources to our patients.

### Mindfulness Based Stress Reduction

Our Mindfulness Based Stress Reduction program offered an evidence-based 8-week journey. Quickly filling all spots, it yielded remarkable results—87% reported positive shifts including reduced anxiety and improved well-being.

### LIFE Beyond Cancer

To aid patients in transitioning to post-treatment life, the transformative "LIFE Beyond Cancer" series was introduced. This program, spanning 4 weeks, received exceptional interest, with 5 series completing throughout the year. Yoga & Art

Responding to patient feedback for increased programming in the area of art therapy and creativity, our counselling and exercise team collaborated to develop and facilitate a Yoga and Art workshop.

### Connections with Primary Care Physicians & Network


Working with multiple Divisions of Family Practice, Doctors of BC, and the Practice Support Program to educate and increase awareness of services and support available for patients.

## SUPPORTING RESEARCH IN THE COMMUNITY

### 2022/2023 Highlights

### Gynecologic Cancer Survivorship Series

Together with Dr. Lesa Dawson and partners, we contributed to an interactive Cancer Survivorship Series, addressing anxiety, sexual health, menopause, cognitive challenges, and work reintegration.

### Partnership with Dr. Amanda Wurz

Collaborated with Dr. Amanda Wurz from the University of the Fraser Valley to support her research on physical activity for individuals affected by cancer from diagnosis onward.

### Collaboration with University of Victoria

Collaborated with researchers from University of Victoria to co-author a study examining correlates and participation in InspireHealth's online exercise programming before and during COVID-19.

### Anew Research Collaborative Engagement

Engaging in the Anew Research Collaborative, we co-developed a 5-week series exploring creativity to understand AYA cancer experiences, reflecting our commitment to underserved populations.

## **FINANCIAL RESULTS**

# We are extremely pleased to report we ended the year with a surplus of \$120K versus a budgeted deficit of (\$300K).

We continue to provide our services free of charge.






